- Critical Incident Policy was discussed and ratified by the BOM on 20.11.2017

- Building: The BOM are aware that we are currently at Site Acquisition Stage. The County
  Council has identified 3 possible sites in the Clonard area, the Dept. of Ed will make a

  again, write to all TD's regarding our new school building. The Chair has raised the issue as
  PQ in the Dáil on several occasions
- Car Park: The BOM notes the concerns from PAC AGM and meeting. Again the BOM wants to
  reiterate that we cannot make any alterations to the car park as we do not own it. The BOM
